



BEEKEEPING WEEKEND COURSES FOR BEGINNERS 2018

One to be held at Swanley Grange, Fountains Abbey, near Ripon and the other at RHS Harlow Gardens Harrogate

If you have decided that you would like to keep bees, or if you would like some more detailed information before committing yourself then this course is a good place to start. This two day course over a single weekend is intended to provide adults or young people (age 16+) with a more detailed insight into bees and beekeeping than can be achieved in our one day Taster Course. There will be talks, demonstrations and as much practical beekeeping as time and weather allow. In addition the course will include material on bee biology, beekeeping equipment, swarming, apiary sites, forage, diseases and honey extraction and other hive products .

If the course convinces you that you want to keep bees then the level of information should enable you to start at once, with assistance from an experienced beekeeper as a mentor. We would recommend that you join your local Beekeeping Association (search the Internet for details), who should be able to provide a suitable person to help you. Alternatively, if at the end of the Course you feel that you would like a more extensive understanding of bees and beekeeping before you start, then you will be well equipped to take a more in-depth course that will give you a lot of additional information.

Each day will commence at 10.00 am and run through until about 5.00 pm. Coffee and tea refreshments and lunch will be provided on both days. Protective jackets and gloves will be provided on loan and you will need loose fitting trousers and Wellington boots or stout walking shoes/boots.

In 2018 one course will be held on the weekends of the 16th/17th June in the classroom at the Swanley Grange buildings on the National Trust's Fountains Abbey site and a second Course will be held on the weekends of the 30th June and 1st of July in a classroom in the Learning Centre at the RHS Gardens at Harlow Carr Harrogate. Each course will use honeybee colonies in nearby apiaries belonging to the Beekeeping Association.

The course fee of £104 covers the cost of tuition, clothing hire, coffee and tea, and a light lunch on both days,.

This Association runs an excellent Long Course for Beginners starting in January each year. This long course will give you a great deal of knowledge and practical experience of beekeeping and is an excellent follow on from a Weekend Course if you decide that you would like to take up beekeeping as a pastime and to learn much more about it.

Harrogate and Ripon Beekeepers Association was founded in 1921 and currently has an overall membership of over 450. The Association provides stands promoting beekeeping at a number of large Shows and events in and around the Harrogate District every year. It also provides a range of meetings and courses enabling beekeepers to improve and develop their skills further.

Beekeepers of today are joining a long tradition, as human beings have kept bees in hives (of various sorts) for well over 6,000 years, and honey harvesting probably goes back to the very dawn of human development.
